JOSH DUHAMEL WINS JACK LEMMON AWARD AT THE AT&T PEBBLE BEACH NATIONAL PRO-AM

Monterey, California – Actor Josh Duhamel has been named the Most Valuable Amateur of the 2010 AT&T Pebble Beach National Pro-Am. Duhamel, a 12 handicapper, helped his professional partner, Sergio Garcia, by 30 strokes. In winning the award, Duhamel received the Jack Lemmon Award, suitably named after the Academy Award winning actor who failed to make the famous Saturday night ‘cut’ a record number of times. Lemmon, who died in 2001, played in the tournament for over 30 years.

“Being named the 2010 Jack Lemmon Award winner either means I’m a sandbagger, or a lousy golfer who played out of his mind,” states Duhamel. “Either way, I am honored because Jack Lemmon is not only one of my all time favorite actors, but was an incredible ambassador for the game of golf. Thank you Mr. Lemmon. You are truly missed.”

Duhamel joined a host of other Hollywood celebrities and sports stars at the 2010 AT&T Pebble Beach National Pro-Am. Dustin Johnson of South Carolina, the current leader in the PGA TOUR's FedEx Cup standings, won the event for the second straight year with a birdie on number 18 at Pebble Beach Golf Links.
